1 Borimsa One of the 3 Borimsa Temple in the East

 Borimsa is one of the 3 temples in East Asia, including the Gajisan temples located in India and China. It was founded around 860, so it is about 1,200 years old. It holds 10 national treasures, including three-story stone pagodas and the stone lantern of Borimsa Temple, Jangheung (National Treasure No. 44), seated iron Vairocana Buddha statue of Borimsa Temple (National Treasure No. 117), etc. In particular, "Worin Seokbo Vol. 25" (Treasure No. 745-9), which is a valuable resource for Korean history research, also came from Borimsa Temple. It is recommended that you drink the mineral water from Borimsa as it is considered as 'Korea's top 10 clean water'. The rutmeg tree forest at the back of the temple is a good place to enjoy nature.

2 Tamjin River Experience an ecological exploration and festival in Jangheung, known for its good 'water'

 The Tamjin River is a grade 1 water that runs through the middle of Jangheung-eup. It adds to the picturesque of a trip to the town as it is connected to the Jeongnamjin Jangheung Saturday Market and Jeongnamjin Water Science Museum. You can also take a walk around the Tamjin River Ecological Wetland located north of Jangheung Bridge. The ecological observations, stepping stones, etc. provide a relaxing rest place. It is said that if you ring the Bell of Hope three times in the artificial island found in the middle of the pond, your wish will come true. Once you pass by Yeyang-Gyo from the Tamjin River Ecological Wetland, you will see the Jangheung Riverside Sports Park. The Jeongnamjin Jangheung Aqua Festival is held here from July to August.

3 Cheam-san A mountain outing following the flowers

 If silver grass at Cheongwansan Mountain is representative of autumn, then royal azaleas in Cheam-san is what represents spring. From the end of April to mid-May, royal azaleas bloom at the bottom of Saja-san up to the peak of Cheam-san, covering approximately 6 km of the mountainous area. Among those, the best part of the azalea plains is between Ganje and Gornje, past the peak of Saja-san. Another unexpected area of Cheam-san is the Kiamkyoseok (oddly formed rocks and strangely shaped stones). Cheam means "king rock". It is called as such because the surrounding rocks are facing down towards the peak rock. The landscape is breathtaking with Hyeongjebawi Rocks standing out.

4 Jeongnamjin Jangheung Saturday Market A traditional market with Jangheung samhap and fun

 Beside the Tamjin River, there is a boisterous bazaar market which is representative of Jangheung. On days that end with 2 and 7, there is a five-day market, and there is a Saturday Market every Saturday. In particular, the Jeongnamjin Jangheung Saturday Market is Korea's first weekend cultural tourism market. Specialties from the mountains, fields, and the ocean from the 10 municipalities of Jangheung-gun can be found in this place. There are also vegetable gardens and merchant stores run by young people. The owners of the vegetable gardens are grandmothers. It is fun to bargain. The stores of the young people are the vitality of the market.

5 Jeongnamjin Cypress Woodland A comfortable day in the cypress forest

 When you walk through the tall cypress trees at Jeongnamjin Cypress Woodland, you soon forget about your day-to-day struggles. This is because the phytonoid, which is a natural antimicrobial substance excreted by cypress trees, has the power to heal the body and the mind. The deck road allows you to walk with strollers. The cypress samjimjang (Korean dry sauna) within the Woodland is a healing facility that uses salt. It is divided into salt massage room, salt detoxification room, salt caves, etc., and it helps in cleansing the body and mind. The place also provides a forest commentary, woodworking trail, and accommodation.

6 Sodeungseom A filming location with a captivating sunrise in winter

 Sodeungseom is located on the coastal waters of Nampo Village. Nampo Village is a place where Director Im Kwon-taek filmed "Festival", which is based on the novel of Yi Chong-jun, who was born in Jangheung. It is a fishing village that looks like it came straight out of a movie scene. The name Sodeungseom is derived from the word 'sodeung' (small lamp), i.e. a kerosene lamp, which means to light up the island while waiting for the family to return from fishing. This place is a popular place for sunrise during winter, and is the pride of the Jangheung people. It is sought out by photographers. There are two rides from Nampo Village to Sodeungseom every day during low tide. In Sodeungseom, you will see a female sculpture, altar, rock statue, etc.

7 Cheongwansan Crown of the rock, a silver flame grass

 Cheongwansan is one of the top 5 mountains in Honam with breathtaking views. As suggested by its name, 'crown of the rock (laan emperor)', Cheongwansan has various rock cliffs that take different forms such as the baby rock, lion rock, and so on. In addition, the Yeondaebong Peak is spread out on three sides, showing the view of Dadohae like a folding screen. On top of this, the reason for hiking the mountain in the fall is because of the flame grass. In the fall, flame grass is scattered in its silvery gleam all the way from Hwanheedeup to the Yeondaebong Peak. There are many ways to go mountain climbing, but the most popular route is to start from Jangcheonjae parking lot to the Geumganggul Cave.

8 Jeongnamjin Observatory A landmark in Jeongnam in the Korean Peninsula

 The Jeongnamjin Observatory is located near the ferry in the Jeongnamjin area of Seoul and the Usando Sightseeing District of Jeongnamjin. It is 10 stories high with a height of 45.9m. The upper side visualizes the rising sun, the middle part the Hwangpoo mast, and the lower part the wave. There is a book cafe, literary movie theater, memory travel hall, festival hall, trick-art photo zone, etc. on the 2nd to the 8th floors. There is a skywalk on the 10th floor, and on the 9th floor cafe, you can see the gorgeous island scenery that is unique to Deungyang. You can also see a floor fountain in the shape of the Korean Peninsula at the Unification Square, as well as 'yool-ryo - The beginning of a match' which is a 7-meter-high sculpture that marks the area of Jeongnam.

9 Seonhakhong Village Rape blossom village where novels and films were born

 Director Im Kwon-taek's "Beyond the Years", which is based on Yi Chong-jun's short story, "Seonhakhong Traveler", is the sequel to "Seopyeonje". Until today, the stand-up bar, which is the main stage of "Beyond the Years", can be found in the village. In the southeast part of the film location, you can see Seonhakhong Village, which has Gongji-san at the back. Originally it was called Sanjeo Village, but its name was changed once the movie was released. In the spring, rape blossoms bloom in the village so, sometimes it is called the Seonhakhong Rape Blossom Village. In the fall, this is replaced by buckwheat flowers. It is worth walking through the Yi Chong-jun Novel Literature Route (Yi Chong-jun, Han Seung-won Literature Route - Course 2) which is surrounded by flowers.



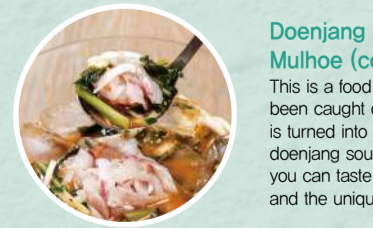
9 tastes



Jangheung samhap
 Jangheung samhap is a specialty of Jangheung, consisting of Jangheung hanwoo (Korean beef), shiitake mushroom, and pen shell straight from Deungyang. You can taste this at the Jeongnamjin Jangheung Saturday Market.



Maesaengi (seaweed fulvescens) Soup
 Just because it is similar to green laver, do not compare it with green laver. It is enough to just put oysters and mussels, then season it with salt and soy sauce. It has a soft texture and rich flavor.



Doenjang (soybean paste) Mulhoej (cold raw fish soup)
 This is a food wherein fish that has been caught offshore of Jangheung is turned into sashimi, then mixed with doenjang soup. It is a delicacy wherein you can taste the lightness of soybean, and the unique flavor of sashimi.



Kijogae (pen shell) Dish
 If you have been to Sunun Beach, you may have heard the Sunun Kijogae Village. While great with Jangheung samhap, try tasting the original flavor of pen shell.



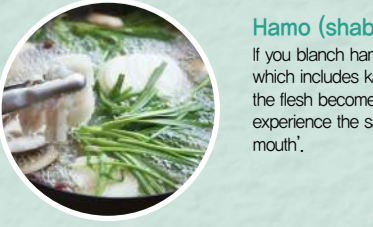
Bajirak (clam) Hoe-muchim (spicy raw fish salad)
 This is the same bajirak sashimi that appeared in "2 Days 1 Night". Dried clams, water parsley, shiitake mushrooms, etc. are sliced thinly and seasoned, then it becomes an "appetite restorer"—and a healthy diet is completed.



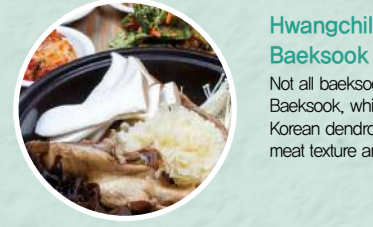
Grilled oyster
 Jangheung oyster that has been collected from the clean sea is called 'the milk of the ocean' but it tastes amazing when you put it in your mouth. People of Jangheung enjoy eating oysters by grilling it on stone-plates over firewood.



Cuttlefish sashimi, mukjimm (ink steam)
 The 'king of squid' is really cuttlefish sashimi. The more you chew it, the more flavor you get. Of course, you cannot skip out on mukjimm, which steams the whole cuttlefish including its inwards and ink.



Hamo (shabu-shabu)
 If you blanch hamo (pike eel) in a broth which includes kalopanax, juube, etc., the flesh becomes soft. You can truly experience the saying "it melts in your mouth".



Hwangchil (Korean dendropanax) Baeksook (boiled in plain water)
 Not all baeksooks are the same. Hwangchil Baeksook, which was cooked by adding Korean dendropanax extract, has a softer meat texture and its soup tastes better.

9 products



Jangheung mushroom
 You may already know this if you have tasted Jangheung samhap, but Jangheung mushroom is the best. It is a product that has received international organic certification and is produced in the traditional way from pine forests.



Jangheung Musan Laver
 There is a special culture method for Jangheung Laver. They use an eco-friendly way of exposing the laver bed to sunlight and air to remove the green layer. It is an acid-free laver as it does not undergo hydrochloric acid treatment.



Octopus
 Jangheung octopus has a sweet flavor, and a very chewy texture. The secret to its taste is hidden in the mud flat unique to Deungyang that reach from Hojin-myeon to Anyang-myeon.



Hanwoo and beef jerky
 There are more cattle than people in Jangheung. Above all, the hanwoo here has higher essential fatty acids and a better meat quality compared to other hanwoo. The taste of beef jerky therefore depends on the quality of the beef.



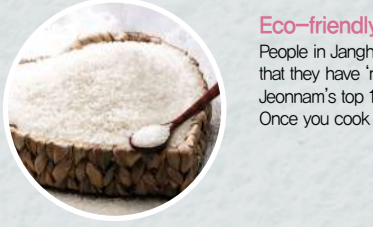
Cheongtae-jeon
 The reason for its name is due to its 'coin-shaped tea with a green moss'. This is a fermented tea developed in Jangheung ever since the period of the Three States. It is fermented in a jar for over a year, so it has a soft and mild taste.



Oriental raisin tree
 Liver function activation and detoxification effect! This is the reason why you recommend the Jangheung oriental raisin tree. Jangheung now produces 37% of the country's oriental raisin tree production, so Jangheung is known for this too.



Hwangchil Tree (Korean Dendropanax)
 Compared to the original effects of the Korean Dendropanax, the Hwangchil Baeksook, which was cooked by adding Korean dendropanax extract, has a softer meat texture and its soup tastes better.



Eco-friendly rice 'Aremi'
 People in Jangheung very rarely say that they have 'no appetite'. 'Aremi' is Jeongnam's top 10 high-quality rice brand. Once you cook the rice, it shines.



Maesaengi
 Only those who have cooked using Jangheung maesaengi will know. You do not need to put a lot of ingredients, but it tastes good. This is the advantage of Jangheung maesaengi, which is soft and rich in flavor.
